

Looking Ahead to Lent

Lent begins in less than three weeks on Ash Wednesday, February 26. Holy Mass and the Distribution of Ashes will take place at 8:00 AM, 12:00 Noon, and 7:00 PM. We have a grave obligation to keep Ash Wednesday a day of fasting and abstinence. Fasting means that everyone from the age of 18 years to their 59th birthday is obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting usually means only one full meal and two partial meals. It would normally preclude snacks in between meals, unless there are health issues involved. Voluntary fasting on other days of Lent, especially Fridays is highly recommended. Abstinence means that all persons who have already celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

The three pillars of Lent are prayer, self-denial, and charity. The penitential practices are the means by which we are equipped to fight against sin and temptation, make amends for sin, and draw closer to God. These three pillars support us in rebuilding our relationship with God, self, and others—relation-



ships that sin has damaged. To avail oneself of all the graces of penitence, our Lenten resolutions should not just be limited by giving something up or other acts of self-denial. Our Lent should include taking more time each day to pray, over and above our normal daily prayer routine. Lent also requires us to bind all our practices together with the bond of charity. Self-denial frees resources in our lives that normally we would spend on ourselves. In self-denial, our self-interest is transformed into true compassion and charity towards others, especially in the form of almsgiving for the poor.



Steve Angrisano is one of the most effective and versatile ministry leaders in the Church today. People of all ages embrace the passionate message of faith woven throughout his music and storytelling. A veteran musician, composer and youth minister, he's performed at seven World Youth Days (Panama 2019, being his latest WYD), the National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC), and many other national and international events.

Steve burst onto the contemporary Catholic music scene in 1998 with *Make a Difference*, his first album. Co-written with Tom Tomaszek, the collection features the iconic "Go, Make a Difference" and the popular Mass of a Joyful Heart. More than seven collections later, including *Welcome Home* and *A New Day*, Steve shows no signs of slowing down. In 2007 he released *Live: Songs from the Road*, a spine-tingling live-performance CD, and a companion songbook/guide titled *Essential Songs: A Road-Tested Resource for Youth Ministry*. Many of his songs have entered the mainstream worship repertoire, including "Psalm 63: My Soul Is Thirsting," "Emmanuel," and "Sweet Redeemer." His most recent collection is *High Above Our Way*, offering nine songs for liturgy, prayer and inspiration, including a handful of songs co-written with fellow Catholic composer Curtis Stephan.



NOTES FROM VICKI

Hello, Dear Friends In Christ!

The gospel this week is telling all of us to show our faith by being ourselves, letting our lights shine and our voices ring! In order to be our shiny selves, we MUST start our day with God. There is no way around it and no substitute for prayer. So just to prevent bland salt in your soul, I suggest a Prayer Corner in your home. A fireplace mantle works perfect, or a small end table or wall shelf. I have seen some elaborate Prayer Corners that were gorgeous and decorated in ways I could never manage. My decorating is always very simple: Start with a nice white cloth then place the bible in the middle, the candle to one side, a small bottle of holy water, a crucifix hung or standing above the bible and a Catholic prayer book. Now add a Rosary and you are all set! If these items are visible to everyone in your home, you are evangelizing! Children can pause for a few seconds to recognize His presence, say a few words or say thank you. As a family, make it part of your daily routine to give thanks for all the blessings He has given you. Ask for a blessing for an event or special day, or maybe

someone needs an extra prayer for strength or healing. Keep things simple and specific, using words and symbols that everyone understands. Once the concept becomes a habit, the calm and peace that ensues is beyond measure. (That does not mean everyone will behave and it will be quiet). BUT it will become a place of hope and love. God's visible presence is an instant lift to your spirits. Someone who is hurting or searching for healing will be drawn to your humble Prayer Corner because you are giving them a place to be vulnerable. Children also love and need to pray so provide a place for them to talk to our Father.

In our Catholic school we had prayer time every morning in the gym. It was actually the highlight of our day because we learned a lot about our families! Each child had a chance to offer their prayer and even the shy ones participated. They all knew they were loved and that the staff truly believed in God and his kindness and mercy, especially to children. There were always heartfelt prayers for relatives and sick pets, grandparents with bad breath, and for siblings to stay away from their toys. But there were the ones that

broke your heart, too. One family lost a full-term baby during the birth, and his brothers were devastated. One of them was in 2nd grade and his prayer for an entire month was for God to hold his baby brother until his mom or dad got there. The staff cried every day. This family was strong in their faith and prayed every day with their children, as did most of the families at our school. Being at Mass is not the only measure of a good Catholic. Being a good Catholic outside of church is a true measure, and the one that matters to everyone in our lives. Being a good Catholic means prayer is part of who you are.

Let me know if you set up a Prayer Corner, or send me a picture! I would love to see it! Regardless of where you are, just pray! A silent "Hail Mary" or a loud "Hallelujah!" Just tell Him what you want to say!

Deliberate acts of charity during Lent are what ensures that our other Lenten practices do not become occasions of pride and vanity. Jesus calls this "almsgiving" from the word that indicates acting mercifully towards another who is in a situation of need. For over forty years, the US church has supported Operation Rice Bowl, a program that is the major source of funding for the Church's efforts to feed the hungry. Don't forget to pick your Rice Bowl up before Lent begins. In addition to our common works of charity, use the money that you would have otherwise spent on the things you gave up for Lent and donate that money to Hope House or another local social service organization.
