All of us have experienced disruptions in our lives. Past traumas and pain are resurfacing and rebounding in our hearts as we sift through the news and plot our next steps to keep our loved ones healthy. Our community is in different stages of understanding and responding to the potential sickness. What do we do? This is your call to responsibility. Lives are depending on it.

I am so sorrowful that our worship together must be suspended. It is what must be done if we are to minimize as much as we can the suffering that will come upon so many if we fail to act. This is a test of faith that few of us have ever imagined. But now it is here. The fasting and sacrifice that are placed upon us that we don't choose but gladly embrace, that is always the source of greater grace.

Your health and well-being means so much to me. Please take seriously all the guidelines for keeping healthy that come from trusted medical sources. There is nothing that could demonstrate to us the Christian obligation to act in charity as cooperating with community health protocols. Your health depends on this, but even more important from Christ's point of view, the health of others depends on it.



This past week's focus for me is to set up a platform to keep us connected in prayer and worship. Our streamed masses are very important for our community. I am looking at the numbers of viewers. We need to see them grow. That will be my sign that you are paying attention and our community can work together in the coming days as this disease continues its course. The more we pray together, the more we will be ready to assist those in need.

During this time of suspended liturgies and social distancing, some have asked what to do about their weekly contributions. I am pleased to say that we have a number of options available.

First, the online option is available on our website:

ourladylake.diojefcity.org
 At the very top of the page is a button that says "Donate Now." Clicking on this will bring up our online giving page. You can create an account. You have options for contributing weekly or monthly. There are also options for the second collections that we have throughout the year as well as the Parish Charity Fund, flower donations, and other donations. You also have the option of setting this up as an automatic withdrawal from your bank account or charging your credit card.

For those who prefer not to use the online option, we have an automatic monthly draw option. I can provide a form for you to fill in your information, and Central Bank of the Lake of the Ozark will process a transfer from your account to ours on either the 5th or 20th of the month.

Finally there is always the option of simply mailing in your envelopes.

Current Office Procedures for Social Distancing

In order to help limit exposure for our parishioners and staff, we have implemented some new policies. First, just a reminder that all public liturgies and devotions have been cancelled until at least April 3rd. If it is necessary to meet in person, please call ahead to set up a meeting with the staff person that you need to see. During business hours we will have a drop box for the office and Hope House set up outside the back door. Please feel free to drop items there then ring the buzzer on the right hand wall in order to notify staff what you have left.

Currently, Mary will be in the office on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday and working from home Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Kelly will be working from home Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, and will be in the office on Tuesdays and Thursdays. All staff will be checking their voicemail and email frequently.

Please remember that the church is opened for prayer and comfort during regular office hours. We ask that you enter and leave via the front doors near Bagnell Dam Blvd. We also ask that no more than 10 people be present in the church at one time, please leave adequate spacing between persons.



NOTES FROM VICKI

Dear Friends in Christ!

Well, this is quite a pickle right now but let's make something good of all the anxiety! First, go get your bible and look up John 1:29. "Jesus takes away the sin of the world." He takes it away at its source. Did you know that anxiety is a sin because we are not trusting God? Scott Hahn writes, "He doesn't just forgive sin; He uproots it by removing our sinful heart. But then He goes one better still. Ezekiel 36:26 tells us (26) "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. (27) And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws." How can God DO that?

No, it's not surgery! It's CONFESSION! When was the last time you compared your heart and mind to the Ten Commandments? For most of us, it has been quite a long time. Sit down with a pencil and paper and think about how you compare to each Commandments. Every self-revelation and self-exploration we will ever need can be obtained through this Examination of Conscience.

At every stage, we must depend on the clear sight we gain in this Examination IF AND ONLY IF we

follow it with sacramental confession to a priest. There is no alternative to repentance. It seems impossible to those who have more pride than what allows them to be vulnerable. (I've used that word before...) If we keep thinking, "I can do this alone. I'm smart enough. I don't need anyone's help. No one can tell me what to do. I know best," and on and on, it means we resent God's help and choose to go on feeling guilty for the less-than-intelligent things we manage to accomplish. If we don't confess that guilt, we just project it onto others! It is so true that we hurt the ones we love the most! If we do not confess our sins, we, like Adam, will end by blaming God! The Ten Commandments make our sight completely clear if we get Satan out of the way.

The church is open. Msgr is taking scheduled confessions. You probably have a few extra minutes for the next couple of weeks. What you don't have is an excuse! Examine your conscience and let Msgr or your parish priest, through the Holy Spirit himself, create in you a clean heart. It is a freedom that cannot be compared to anything else on this earth.

Un mensaje del Obispo W. Shawn McKnight

Estimados hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Sé que se unen a mí en la preocupación por todos los afectados por la rápida propagación del coronavirus. Hoy, anuncio que todas las Misas públicas se suspenderán en la Diócesis de Jefferson City, a partir del miércoles 18 de marzo y por lo menos hasta el 3 de abril.

Esto es para ir de acuerdo con las directivas federales y otras entidades públicas en nuestra área. Ofrecemos esta decisión como parte de nuestro esfuerzo en ayudar a detener la propagación del coronavirus.

Esto significa que todos los católicos están exentos de la obligación de asistir a la Misa dominical en persona. Las oportunidades en línea se enumeran en nuestro sitio web, y algunas parroquias podrán ofrecer Misas en línea. Se alienta a los católicos a consultar con su parroquia local sobre las Misas en línea.

Además, las parroquias han recibido instrucciones de realizar los siguientes cambios a partir del 18 de marzo:

Todas las reuniones públicas se cancelan o posponen. Esto incluye bodas públicas. Puede encontrar más información sobre bautizos, funerales y otros protocolos litúrgicos aquí.

Las misas de confirmación se reprogramarán para celebrarse después del Domingo de Pascua.

Durante este tiempo, las iglesias permanecerán abiertas como lugares de oración y consuelo. Los sacerdotes estarán disponibles en las parroquias para ofrecer la unción de los enfermos y otros sacramentos. Se le recomienda buscar el sacramento de la unción de los enfermos antes de ir al hospital, si es posible.

Les pido que sean conscientes de su responsabilidad de servir a la comunidad con su tiempo, talento y tesoro en estos momentos extraordinarios de necesidad. Pueden dar a conocer su capacidad de voluntariado llenando un formulario en nuestro sitio web. Las parroquias están organizando equipos de ayuda para atender a los que han sido ya afectados por la pandemia de coronavirus. Por favor, continúe con su contribución económica a sus parroquias por correo postal o en línea si la parroquia ofrece esa opción.

Las escuelas diocesanas, que suspenden la instrucción en la escuela del 18 de marzo al 3 de abril, estarán brindando instrucción continua ya sea en línea o por paquetes, según lo decida la escuela. Si bien las oficinas diocesanas y las oficinas parroquiales permanecerán abiertas, algunos empleados pueden trabajar de forma remota o necesitar permiso para cuidarse a sí mismos o de sus familias. Algunas parroquias pueden reducir el horario de oficina. En cualquier caso, todos los empleados diocesanos y parroquiales continuarán recibiendo compensación.

Agradezco a todos los que trabajan incansablemente para mitigar los efectos de la pandemia. Oro para que los esfuerzos que estamos haciendo como personas de fe, proporcionen un apoyo tangible, aliento y esperanza espiritual a nuestras comunidades.
