
## Praise the Passover Victim

Victimae Paschali Laudes is the Easter Sunday sequence, the beautiful hymn sung after the second reading but before the Gospel acclamation. The first lines in English urges Christians to offer a sacrifice of praise to the Paschal Victim. Through the years, I have been working on a full translation into English of this hymn. It's not too hard to get the meaning across. Much harder it is to make the translation poetic, be faithful to the Latin grammar and meaning, and fit into a singable meter.

There is one particular word that continues to puzzle me. The third sentence begins with mors et vitae duello confluxere mirando: "death and life clashed in a spectacular battle". The word "mirando" is a tough one. The present translation in the Missal gives us "death and life contended: combat strangely ended." I think the desire to get the rhyme correct totally misses the point.

"Mirando" is from miror which means to gaze at, look at in amazement or to be amazed. Our word "miracle" comes from this root. I guess "spectacular" does lead us into some sense of seeing something amazing, but the word is just too big for this point in the hymn. I like the English rooted words that have to do with awe-inspiring sights. We use these



words all the time about events that move us in a certain way. "Spectacular" certainly gets at the idea that there is something special to look at, but it doesn't get to the effect in the spectator.

This is really what the Latin word miror conveys. It isn't just looking upon something passively. Miror means that you are looking at something and it provokes a special kind of feeling. The Anglo-Saxon root of the word "awe" gets it better. If you look at something and it can fill you with a sense of fear, terror, or dread, it is "awful". Weirdly enough, we can look at something and say it is "awesome". It's the same root at play, but giving us a totally powerful sense of amazement at what is happening before our eyes.

During this time of suspended liturgies and social distancing, some have asked what to do about their weekly contributions. I am pleased to say that we have a number of options available.

First, the online option is available on our website:

At the very top of the page is a button that says "Donate Now." Clicking on this will bring up our online giving page. You can create an account. You have options for contributing weekly or monthly. There are also options for the second collections that we have throughout the year as well as the Parish Charity Fund, flower donations, and other donations. You also have the option of setting this up as an automatic withdrawal from your bank account or charging your credit card.





## NOTES FROM VICKI

Dear Friends in Christ!

Acts 10: 37-43 says "...He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

That's it. The whole shebang! WE are to tell everyone that Jesus is God's Son! WE are to tell everyone He will judge the living and the dead for their deeds here on Earth! WE are to tell everyone they can be forgiven of anything, no matter how deep their life choices have taken them down.

This last part of the Easter Sunday Gospel reading is the synopsis of our faith. All the parables, all the stories, all the history in the Bible lead to these conclusions. There is no ambiguity here; it's very clear.

God even gave us angels to help us make decisions and to watch over us. Remember Jacob's Ladder? Can you imagine seeing all those heavenly beings just going up and down and tending to all of us here on Earth? I am amazed at how much God loves us, and how He is constantly reminding us that we have all the tools we will ever need to get to Heaven! Prayer, Forgiveness, Gifts of the Holy Spirit, Mercy, Grace and Love unending!

Can you feel the passion I am feeling right now? Can you feel the passion in your own heart for the One who gave His life for Us and His Father who made it so? There is nothing else to add. We have it all!

We will ALWAYS have it all because He loves us.

When you are tempted to complain about being cooped up right now, and for possibly several more weeks, I challenge you to go watch the video on formed.org at this address <https://watch.formed.org/videos/triduum> You will see the path Jesus walked, the buildings constructed to protect those sites and the reverence of the entire culture; which is many cultures together worshiping Jesus Christ and His Father.

We are His family, warts and all. He made us all differently to serve different purposes. Take people where they are, don't impose your judgements. You have no idea why or how they were led to your path. (The Holy Spirit puts people on your path for a reason) All you know for sure is that God made all of us to love each other because of our differences. Nothing else is in your control so, "smile and nod, boys, smile and nod." (The penguins of Madagascar)

COMMUNITY OUTREACH: Now that school has officially been cancelled for the remainder of the year, I am aware that many children are endangered by their own home surroundings. Easter is not likely a time of celebration for these families. Domestic violence has dramatically increased and tempers are even more likely to flare during the stress of losing jobs and cabin fever. Stress is not an excuse for being irresponsible or criminally neglectful.

A significant portion of my job is

to make sure the parish knows how we educate on child AND dependent abuse and mandatory reporting of these situations. When an anomaly such as Covid19 puts children in danger of more than just sickness, I have to speak up! I can feel the Lord's tears...

If you have young children, someone with special needs, elderly relatives, infirm relatives or dependents, your responsibility is to make sure they are well looked-after even when they drive you crazy! There are many resources to get help, financial aid, to talk a qualified professional or just give you time to calm down. Before you say or do something you will regret, or if you know someone who may be in a bad situation themselves, please give them this information. Jesus knows if you are helping or just standing by while someone is hurting.

Some of the most used are ParentLink WarmLine for eight counties, Citizens Against Domestic Violence, Patient Advocate Foundation and many, many more! Truly, there is an agency for any particular need.

We are all God's family, so please take care of yourself and each other. Mental health is just as important as physical health so don't hesitate to ask for help. We have all been there. Msgr Mak and I are both available to talk. My email is:

With some of my newly acquired free time due to the Corona-virus quarantine, I am enjoying reading the diary of Saint Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska. Saint Sister Faustina was a Polish Roman Catholic nun and mystic. Her apparitions of Jesus Christ in the 1930’s inspired the Roman Catholic devotion to the Divine Mercy and earned her the title of “Secretary of Divine Mercy”.

In this book she states Jesus provided her three ways of spiritually exercising ourselves in mercy towards our neighbor. The first – by our deeds! The second – by our word! The third – by our prayer! During these times where we may have more time alone or without the preoccupation of going here there and everywhere, we can reflect in prayer with what Jesus said by helping our neighbor by our deeds – helping others; by our word – giving encouragement or a lending ear; and by our prayer – daily meditation and prayer for our family, friends, clergy and finally for ourselves. May God Our Father and our Risen Lord – Jesus Christ along with the Holy Spirit be with you and your families on this Easter Sunday! HE IS RISEN – HE HAS TRULY RISEN!!



Easter 2020

He is risen, Alleluia! Just as he said, Alleluia!

As we begin this new season of Easter, our spirits are lifted and renewed with Jesus' promise to bring us back together again. His death and resurrection changed the world forever, making all things new.

During the passion of Jesus, his band of disciples were scandalized by his suffering. They were afraid and they scattered.

Therefore, when Jesus rose from the dead, his first concern was to gather his disciples together once again in Galilee. That is what is so significant in the message he had Mary Magdalen and the other Mary relay to the other disciples: "Do not be afraid. Go tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me." The presence of the risen Jesus brought the band of disciples back together again.

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, we have had to become more isolated from one another:

Some of us are grieving the death of loved ones without the full benefit of our funeral rites and without the consolation that comes from the presence of our dear family and friends in our time of mourning.

Others are struggling to regain their health in hospitals and nursing homes, and again, are without the presence of family and friends to comfort them.

And we all suffer from the social distancing and isolation that come with the "shelter in place" order as our new normal. It is as though we have been scattered from one another. And yet, the suffering and

sacrifices of so many people during this pandemic is not in vain.

The women and men in today's Gospel have an urgency – they are running to find the Lord. We, too, must have a sense of urgency in finding God's salvation by how we respond to the pandemic.

I am inspired by the acts of charity and mercy of so many people: the farmers, grocery store workers and restaurant personnel; truck drivers and delivery people; teachers; health care professionals; public officials; volunteers who are young and old—the list goes on and on.

Together, each of us has an important role to play to stop the spread of the coronavirus and to encourage the spread of God's mercy. And with our tenacious Easter faith, we look forward to the day when we can all go to Church together again. What a great day that will be!

We need everyone to participate in a renewal of faith as we come out on the other side of this crisis. I pray we can discern together, from our response to the pandemic, on how we can be stewards of God's generosity, make our homes even more holy, and make our parishes truly centers of charity and mercy.

We are witnesses of all God has done, and we must proclaim, in our words and in our deeds, that he has made all things new again! I wish you and your families a happy Easter Season, a season of life and love, a season of the Holy Spirit.

And this is my point I want to make for my Easter message to you. On Good Friday, we look at the Passion of Christ and we feel awful. We are overcome with the sadness for what looks like the victory of death. But on Easter Sunday, we look at the Passion of Christ, and we say that it is awesome. Meaning, we have been frightened by what we have encountered in the suffering and death of the Son of God, but now we are filled with hope. In the cosmic duel between life and death, sin and goodness, God and the forces of evil, we know who has won. It is Christ who is the Victor.

I write this message on Holy Saturday. This is the day of silence. This is the day when we ponder the sobering reality of the crucifixion of Jesus. God has not only come to live among us. God has come to die among us. On Holy Saturday, Christ continues the journey he began at the Annunciation. Today he travels down to the abode of death and fights Satan for the souls of the just. What can we say about this battle? It is dreadful. It is horrible. This is all the power of the heavens in a pitched battle against the great enemy which is Death.
