Historical Context	<p>The Gospel is still representing Matthew and Jesus' lifetime. Jesus is constantly traveling to reach as many people as possible before his death, which he knows is coming soon. Keep in mind that Jesus has now been preaching since he was 12, beginning in the Temple. This worship space was known for its corrupt environment and commercial dealings so contrary to what God had in mind for His People. Jesus has learned to use parables that allow for interpretation and application to many cultural factions. The main idea does not vary, such as the concept that we are all connected in One Body, the Church.</p>

## Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Let me now sing of my friend,

Gospel MT 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people:

"Hear another parable.

There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower.

Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?" They answered him, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times."
