Related Saints	St Stephen is recognized as the first Saint in Christian theology. He was stoned to death around 36 AD for blaspheming the Jewish Temple	
Time Period and Associated History	<p>-Historical context begins approximately 701-681 BC when Isaiah prophesies the feast for all God's people. God will destroy death to those who live with Him and receive the feast of rich foods (Eucharist) and wines (Blood of Christ).</p> <p>- The story continues to Paul, writing to the Philippians c 65 AD about the value of living in God's strength in good times and bad. Enduring poverty and humbly living in abundance.</p> <p>-Even the Alleluia was written by Paul to the Ephesians from prison in Rome! He is again stressing that your gifts are from God, not from your own works. DO NOT BOAST. Paul writes about how easy it is to forget and throw God aside if things are inconvenient. Some may show up at the feast who aren't ready to live as God commands, (the man with no wedding garment) and they are ushered out of His Kingdom as well.</p>

Suggestions for Catechists

1. Check for understanding by asking open-ended questions to reinforce the message of this liturgy. "What is Jesus saying here?"
2. Consistently review looking up books of the bible and references in the Catechism of the Catholic Church within your class, not as a separate lesson. It should develop into a routine habit and rote knowledge of both vital references for our Faith! New doors will open when the Catholic Faith is in full view!

5. Are you plotting the journey you are taking this year with your students? Grape vine of butcher paper, brick path, birthday bricks, jig saw puzzle pieces, scripture path, *At the Well as Christ* to the outcasts, etc.

A second time he sent other servants, saying,
'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."'

Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city.

Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.'

The servants went out into the streets
and gathered all they found, bad and good alike,
and the hall was filled with guests.
