Throughout my Deacon's Corner you may notice that many times I refer to the Dominican Sisters who instructed me from first through 12th grade at Our Savior's Grade School and Rott Catholic High School in Jacksonville, Illinois. They truly had a great influence on the lives of so many young men and women. Now, I was not the most studious nor was I the most disciplined within my class of 54 students. My eight-grade teacher in particular, Sister Phillip Neri, had a great influence on me and whipped (both literally and figuratively) me into shape. I ran into her upon leaving mass in 1982, when I was a young First Lieutenant in the United States Army with my family on leave from Germany. I casually asked her if she remembers the time "whipping" me into shape. She said, "No Jim, I don't, but you probably deserved it!"

Sister Phillip Neri also whipped/stirred upon her students with the many aspects/teachings of the Catholic Church. One of those she stressed was the Precepts of the Church and how we, even as young Catholics, needed to act and conduct ourselves. Sister understood that the Precepts described the effort we must make in prayer and in living a moral life while growing

towards the love of God and love of neighbor.

The Five Precepts of the Catholic Church are:

1. To attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor. Go to church. It is that that easy! We must also always try and make an effort to keep Sundays as a day of rest to reconnect with God and our family.

2. To confess our sins at least once a year. Receiving Holy Communion should be done while in a state of grace, therefore going to confession and repairing our relationship with God at least once per year gives us a virtuous chance of receiving Jesus' body and blood, the Eucharist, which is the source and summit of our faith.

3. Receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season. With Easter being the zenith of our Catholic liturgical year, receiving the Eucharist on the day that we commemorate Jesus' resurrection is key to our Faith. Without the resurrection of Jesus, our entire faith would be meaningless.

4. Observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church. This is designed with helping us grow in holiness and God's love by developing a control over our urges/impulses and establishing a true freedom



of worldly detachment.

5. To provide for the needs of the Church. This is our responsibility with providing for the operation and mission of our parish and Our Mother Church freely and generously.

As discussed, Sister Phillip Neri stressed upon her young students the Five Precepts of the Catholic Church and understood their importance with discovering and understanding our Catholic identity. She appreciated their importance with providing a road map for our Christian life on earth towards our ultimate goal – heaven. As we start a new year (2021), let us "whip", not literally, but "stir-in" these Five Precepts of our Catholic identity into our lives.
