From the Pastor's Desk:

Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Healing from sickness and from other maladies has been a sign of God's love and concern for His people from the outset. Our human condition, weakened because of sin, becomes sick, weak, afflicted in many ways. God cares for us and demonstrates this by His healing and forgiveness. At all times and in all places, never be afraid to turn to the Lord in the most troubling of times, for we will experience joy because of His love and mercy towards us.

This Wednesday, February 14th, is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the penitential season of Lent and a day of universal fast and abstinence. Masses with the Blessing and Imposition of Ashes will be held at 8:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. A Liturgy of the Word with the Blessing and Imposition of Ashes will be held at 12:05 p.m.

A summary for fasting and abstinence is as follows: Abstinence applies to everyone fourteen years of age from the consumption of meat. Fasting applies to those of age eighteen to fifty-nine years of age, except for reasons of health. If you have any questions feel free to contact me at the Parish Office.

The Stations of the Cross will be prayed in the church this Friday and all the Fridays of Lent at 4:00 p.m.

Next Sunday, February 18th, the Rite of Sending will be celebrated at the 10:00 a.m. Mass for Mallory Walsh who will be presented that afternoon to Bishop McKnight at the Cathedral for the Rite of Election and the Continuing Call to Conversion. Mallory will enter Full Communion with the Roman Catholic Church at this year's Easter Vigil on Saturday evening, March 30th.

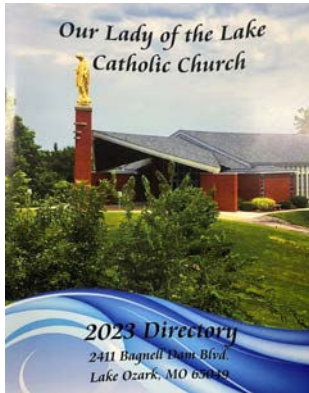

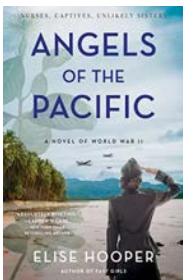

On November 8, Jeff and his two children were hit by a drunk driver. Miraculously, the children are fine, but unfortunately Jeff was not. He suffered a broken neck and a severe spinal cord injury. Don't have time for a regular book club? Our quarterly read is for you. We'll meet once to discuss our book and our Lenten journeys.

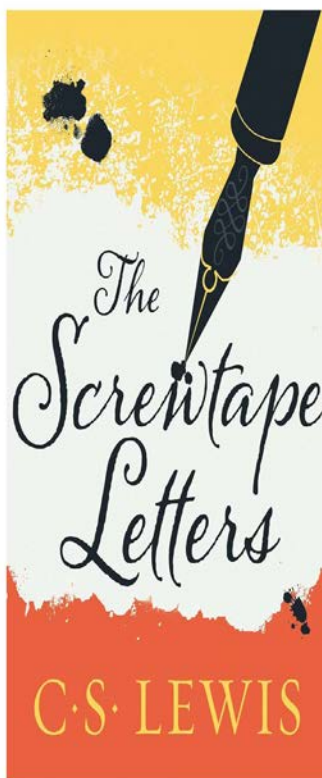
Join us this Lent to discuss CS Lewis' classic, *The Screwtape Letters*!

Sexto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

La curación de enfermedades y otros males ha sido una señal del amor y la preocupación de Dios por su pueblo desde el principio. Nuestra condición humana, debilitada por el pecado, se enferma, se debilita, se aflige de muchas maneras. Dios se preocupa por nosotros y nos demuestra que esto es Su sanación y perdón. En todo momento y en todo lugar, nunca temáis acudir al Señor en los momentos más difíciles, porque experimentaremos gozo por su amor y misericordia hacia nosotros.

Este miércoles 14 de febrero es el Miércoles de Ceniza, inicio del tiempo penitencial de la Cuaresma y día de ayuno y abstinencia universal. Las misas con Bendición e Imposición de Cenizas se realizarán a las 8:00 a. m. y a las 5:30 p. m. A las 12:05 horas se realizará una Liturgia de la Palabra con Bendición e Imposición de Cenizas.

Un resumen del ayuno y la abstinencia es el siguiente: La abstinencia se aplica a toda persona mayor de catorce años del consumo de carne. El ayuno se aplica a las personas de dieciocho a cincuenta y nueve años de edad, excepto por motivos de salud. Si tiene alguna pregunta no dude en ponerse en contacto conmigo en la Oficina Parroquial.

El Vía Crucis se rezará en la iglesia este viernes y todos los viernes de Cuaresma a las 16:00 horas.

El próximo domingo 18 de febrero, se celebrará el Rito de Envío en la Misa de las 10:00 a.m. para Mallory Walsh, quien será presentada esa tarde al Obispo McKnight en la Catedral para el Rito de Elección y el Llamado Continuo a la Conversión. Mallory entrará en plena comunión con la Iglesia Católica Romana en la Vigilia Pascual de este año el sábado 30 de marzo por la noche.
