From the Pastor's Desk:

The 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Thursday morning---August 2nd--- the traffic on HH was significantly backed up due to an auto accident. How uncomfortable I felt as this trek was not picking up speed, because I could not get there as usual. **There was an obstacle in my path and in others' as well.** This is what is classified as non-Christian behavior. I was more concerned about getting to church on time rather than thinking about those involved in the wreck, the emergency workers on scene. The old license and/or bumper sticker **What would Jesus do?** Did pause to make me ponder that I was not behaving or acting in the manner Jesus asked me to.

Jesus welcomes everyone into His Presence, no matter how dysfunctional we might be in circumstances or situations. Be mindful that Jesus invited everyone---including Judas Iscariot--- to His Last Supper table and not only that, but Judas was also the first to leave Mass early, as John the Evangelist mentioned it was cold and dark outside, symbolic of a sinner fleeing from the Holy One of God. 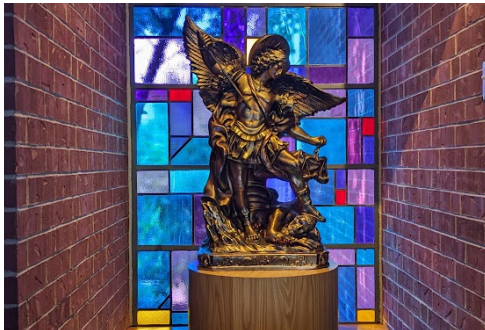

How might you grow as a good and faithful steward? Use these questions in reflection and commitment:

- **Gratitude:** For what are you grateful today? Offer a prayer of praise and thanksgiving for the many blessings you have been given.
- **Gifts:** What gifts (faith, talents, friendships, time, resources) do you perceive in your life at this time? Thank God for these gifts.
- **Response:** Ask the Lord, "What should I do with all I have been given?" How will you respond by giving of yourself or your resources? Who or what will benefit from your service, sharing, caring, and sacrifice? Make a prayerful commitment to share yourself and your resources as a reflection of your commitment to follow Christ as a grateful disciple.
- **Trust:** In what ways are you called to trust in God in order to respond faithfully? Your sharing may include giving in ways that feel uncomfortable; you may be tempted to turn away from your calling, when all you need to do is trust that God will be with you as you share as a grateful disciple. Pray to hold firm to your commitment and recognize God's presence with you as you carry it out.

Your reflection comes full circle, as you recognize the grace of God and as you carry out our commitment to stewardship as a way of life. As we listen to the Lord's call, discern our vocation, and respond generously our parish and community will come to life in new and deeper ways. Now is the time to embrace stewardship as followers of Jesus Christ.

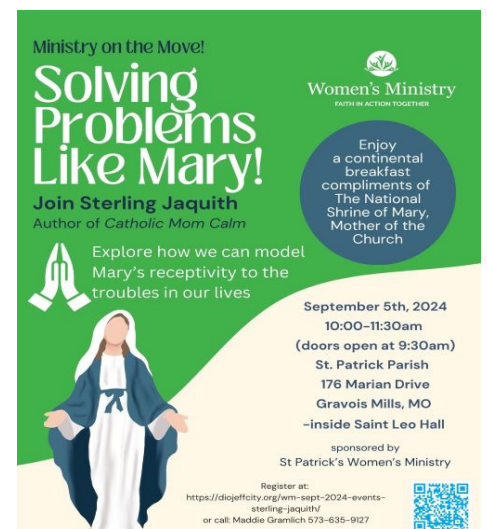
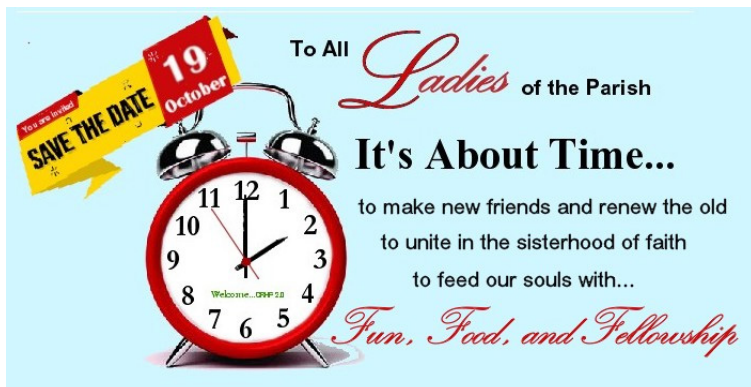

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION CORNER

(Reflection from Pflaum Gospel Weeklies)

Many [of] his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. –John 6:66

Imagine walking out on Jesus. After a heyday of signs, miracles, and proclamations, something he says is so shocking that you count yourself out. You go home, shake the dust off your sandals, and return to business as usual. So much for the dream of a better kingdom!

Yet how many of us do exactly this? This discipleship stuff requires time, attention, study, and prayer. It invites us into relationships, service, responsibility, and commitment.

It demands, over time, that we're transformed into new people entirely—the kind who forgive wrongs, aid the poor, welcome the stranger, love our enemies. At what point will we decide that following Jesus is asking too much and return to a way of life that's easier and leaves more for us?

Attending synagogue on Saturdays was more convenient than traipsing around Galilee and reexamining their assumptions and values. Religion is easy. Discipleship is overwhelming. Do we draw the line between the two and remain on the safe side?

When did being faithful become more than going to church for you? How far are you willing to take your journey with Jesus?

WOMEN IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

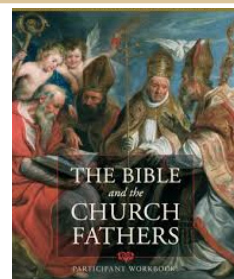
