There are approximately 90k people waiting for a kidney on the kidney transplant list

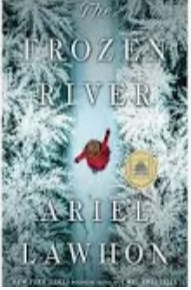

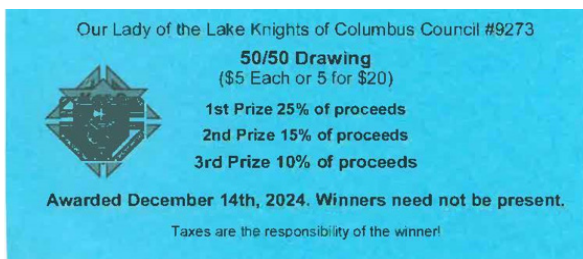
As you purposefully and prayerfully consider your response to the 2024 Catholic Stewardship Renewal. reflect on these questions:

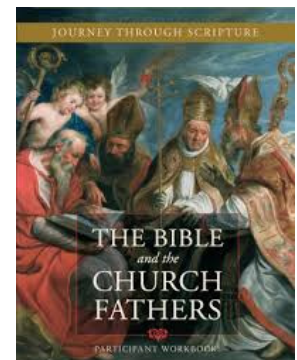
