FRIDAY ADORATION



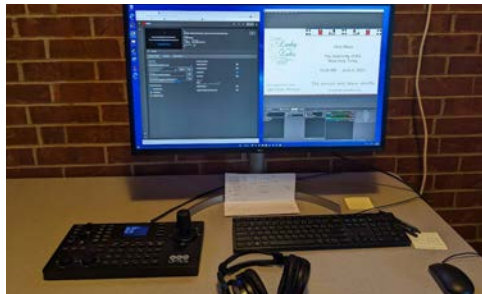
Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is available every Friday from 8:30 AM and concludes with Benediction and Reposition at 2:00 PM.

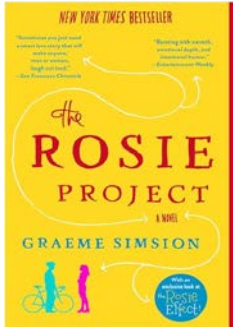

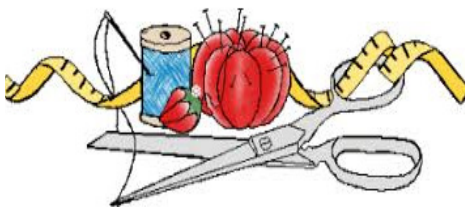

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION CORNER

My favorite radio station, KLOVE 96.1FM is hitting it on all cylinders lately! Today's topic was "Your children will never be too old for what?" My mind immediately took the child to parent role. I thought about how in my 40s and 50s I still sought advice from my mother. I still knew that my mother would always show affection. She would always have a way to make me feel better or empowered during difficult times. She had a way of encouraging me to take that step outside my comfort zone for me to use the gifts that God had given me. She was always just a phone call away. She has been gone for several years now. I still wish that I could just pick up that phone and hear her voice. I also pray that I am that parent for my children and my grandsons. It also reminds us that we have God to turn to whenever we need a pick-me-up and a Blessed Mother, Mary, that will be there to love, guide, and intercede for us.
